


As Safe Kids Minot and Trinity Health Injury Prevention rounds out its 4th year, we are excited to add the following community partners to our injury prevention efforts: North Dakota Brain Injury Network, Fessenden Public Schools, Wells County District Health, Trenton Public School, and North Dakota Department of Health and Human Services.

In June, Safe Kids Minot hosted its inaugural community safety day, Wild About Safety, at Roosevelt Park Zoo. More than 2,000 members of the Minot community were reached with safety information provided by the 25+ safety partners that participated. Enbridge provided free admission for the attendees, while other partners provided rail safety, motor vehicle safety, and medication safety, to name a few.



In August we set in motion our life jacket loaner program in partnership with Brady Martz and Minot Park District. Through this partnership, life jackets are available to the community for loan, at no cost, thanks to a grant from Brady Martz.

Amber recently received her CPST Proxy Certification which created an opportunity for a new partnership with ND Department of Health and Human Services. Amber will work with rural counties in our region to provide car seat checks as well as provide training for technicians in these counties. Car seat technicians need to be observed by a proxy to maintain their certification. In addition to the CPST Certification, Amber also attended a virtual Injury Prevention Coordinator Course. The information was valuable as we prepare for our August Reverification Survey with the American College of Surgeons.


