This past year has been nothing short of remarkable. Thanks to your unwavering support, we achieved a record-breaking total income of \$4.94 million, an extraordinary testament to the strength and compassion of our community. Because of you, we were able to reach several significant milestones:

- **Advancing Women's Health:** We proudly purchased a state-of-the-art 3D mammography system, decreasing compression time, enhancing early detection capabilities and providing more accurate, life-saving screenings for patients across our region.

CANCERCARE PATIENT ASSISTANCE



CancerCare Cottage

The CancerCare Cottage offers a true home away from home for non-resident cancer patients and their families during extended cancer treatment. Designed to promote comfort, dignity and healing, the Cottage provides a peaceful and supportive environment that eases the burden of travel and lodging during an already challenging time.



CancerCare Patient Assistance Fund

The CancerCare Patient Assistance Fund provides direct financial support and essential care items, such as compression garments and therapeutic lotions, to patients undergoing cancer treatment. In fiscal year 2025, the fund delivered more than \$172,000 in direct assistance to 112 patients, alleviating financial burdens and allowing individuals to focus on their healing journey.

Tree of Hope

Ribbon keychains, representing various types of cancer, are presented to patients upon completion of treatment as a meaningful keepsake of their journey. These small but powerful tokens honor resilience, celebrate milestones and serve as a lasting reminder of strength, hope and the support surrounding each patient.



Wig Program

In partnership with Total Beauty Supply, Trinity Health Foundation proudly continues its wig support program for patients receiving care at the Trinity Health CancerCare Center. This program includes a private wig fitting and styling consultation with experienced Total Beauty Supply staff, a wig starter kit and up to \$150 toward the purchase of a new wig. It helps restore confidence, dignity and a sense of normalcy during treatment, made possible through the generosity of our supporters and community partners.



Comfort Care Baskets

Proceeds from the Red Carpet Fundraising Gala funded the creation of 40 Comfort Care Baskets for patients receiving treatment at the Trinity Health CancerCare Center. Each basket was thoughtfully assembled with cozy blankets, socks, puzzle books and special gifts from Deb's Circle of Friends, offering warmth, encouragement and comfort during treatment. This initiative reflects the power of community support and the significant difference it makes in the lives of patients and families we are honored to serve.

BIO Girls – Minot & South Prairie

Trinity Health Foundation proudly awarded a \$5,000 grant to BIO Girls – Minot, ND in support of its 2025 youth programs. BIO Girls empowers girls in grades 2–6 through mentorship, confidence-building curriculum and creative and physical activities led by dedicated local volunteers. This funding helps expand access to the program and ensures no participant is turned away due to financial barriers. Together, we are investing in the mental health, confidence and future of young girls in our community.



Comfort Animals

Stuffed animals are provided to children receiving care at Trinity Health facilities, offering comfort, reassurance and a sense of safety during medical visits. Community Health Alliance Program

Cancer Exercise Rehab

The program also addresses the emotional, mental and spiritual challenges that accompany a cancer diagnosis, supporting whole-person healing throughout treatment and recovery. Because these services are not covered by insurance, generous donor contributions make this vital program accessible at no cost to participants.

During October, 10% of specially marked pink bakery item sales from the 18th Annual Power of Pink promotion were donated to Trinity Health Foundation in support of the Cancer Exercise Rehab. This initiative helps patients regain strength, resilience and confidence throughout their cancer journey.

ADVANCED 3D MAMMOGRAPHY™

Trinity Health Foundation is proud to help bring Advanced 3D Mammography™ to Trinity Health through the extraordinary generosity of our donors and supporters. Community-driven fundraising efforts, including the Trinity Health Foundation Fundraising Gala, Double D-Haw, Building Hope Women's Golf Tournament and Chopper Drop made this important investment in breast health possible.

This state-of-the-art technology is transforming breast care in our region by delivering faster, more accurate screenings with enhanced comfort for patients. Advanced 3D Mammography™ produces images up to 10 times faster, reducing compression time to under 10 seconds. It detects 41% more breast cancers compared to 2D imaging alone and reduces patient callbacks by 40%, easing anxiety and improving the overall experience. The technology also enhances biopsy precision, supporting earlier diagnosis and better outcomes.

"The overwhelming support from our donors and the community made it possible to bring cutting-edge technology like Genius™ 3D Mammography™ exams to Trinity Health," said Dusty Zimmerman, Director, Trinity Health Foundation. *"This investment significantly improves the patient experience and advances early detection and diagnosis, ultimately saving lives and transforming breast care for women in our region."*

ULTRASOUND INITIATIVE

The **Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust** granted \$3,020,087 to Trinity Health Foundation to purchase ultrasound equipment as part of a \$27.4 million ultrasound initiative in North Dakota.

By bridging classroom learning with clinical application, the program supports the development of the next generation of healthcare professionals.

Additionally, Trinity Health donated ultrasound equipment to Roosevelt Park Zoo, further extending the impact of this investment. Rather than retiring still-functioning equipment, Trinity Health Foundation identified an opportunity to repurpose these valuable resources for community benefit. The donated ultrasound equipment will enhance the zoo’s diagnostic capabilities, supporting animal health and enabling the veterinary team to utilize advanced medical technology in their care efforts.

Nursing Scholarships

Trinity Health Foundation proudly awarded scholarships to 10 nursing students and one high school student during its Nursing Scholarship Awards Program on January 9. Funded through the Nursing Scholarship Endowment Fund, these awards support the education of future nurses while strengthening the healthcare workforce in the Minot region.

Three \$10,000 scholarships were awarded to students from Minot State University and Dakota College at Bottineau, each including a two-year employment commitment to Trinity Health upon graduation. Additional \$3,000 scholarships were awarded to nursing students at both institutions, including the Blue Cross Blue Shield of North Dakota scholarship. A \$1,000 scholarship also was awarded to a Minot High School student pursuing a career in nursing.

Through donor generosity, this program continues to invest in nursing education, retain local talent and ensure compassionate, high-quality care for our community.

Radiologic Technology Scholarship

The Michelle Keller Radiologic Technology Scholarship supports senior students in the Trinity Health School of Radiologic Technology. Each year, students submit scientific research papers that are judged anonymously to determine the scholarship recipient. The 2024 scholarship was awarded to Kaitlyn Klein in recognition of her outstanding academic achievement and dedication to the profession.

Minot Chapter of HOSA (Health Occupations Students of America)

Trinity Health Foundation proudly awarded \$10,000 in support of HOSA (Health Occupations Students of America) students from Minot High School and Minot North High School, helping fund their participation in the 2025 HOSA International Leadership Conference. This investment supports hands-on learning, leadership development and the continued growth of future healthcare professionals in our community.

INVESTMENT IN TRINITY HEALTH STAFF

GRACE Fund

The GRACE Fund empowers Trinity Health employees to support one another by voluntarily designating a portion of their paychecks to assist colleagues facing financial hardship due to personal or immediate family emergencies. Through this compassionate program, more than \$42,000 was awarded to 16 staff members, reflecting the strength, generosity and care shared within the Trinity Health team.

Education and Training

Trinity Health Foundation provides critical funding to support staff participation in professional education, conferences and specialized training opportunities. These include programs such as the S.T.A.B.L.E. course for NICU and the ACDIS Symposium for Clinical Documentation Integrity (CDI). Through continued investment in learning and development, this program strengthens clinical expertise, enhances patient care and supports excellence across Trinity Health.

INVESTMENT IN TRINITY HEALTH EQUIPMENT

KDU Chairs

Trinity Health Foundation purchased 12 new recliners for the Kidney Dialysis Unit, enhancing the patient experience for our growing dialysis population. Operating at full capacity, the unit serves more patients than ever, and these recliners provide critical comfort during long treatment sessions, helping to reduce discomfort and anxiety. By replacing 12 chairs, Trinity Health Foundation ensures that dialysis patients receive essential care in a more soothing, supportive environment, demonstrating our commitment to comfort, dignity and high-quality care for every patient.

Radiologic Technology Program Phantom

Trinity Health Foundation proudly supports the future of healthcare education with the addition of a Supertech Whole Body Phantom, affectionately known as “Frankie”, to Trinity Health’s Radiologic Technology Program. This life-size, highly realistic training tool allows students to safely practice real-world clinical scenarios, strengthening technical skills, clinical confidence and critical thinking to prepare the next generation of imaging professionals.





NICU Transport Isolette

Thanks to a partnership with Bravera – Minot and the generosity of donors, Trinity Health Foundation was able to purchase a much-needed NICU (Neonatal Intensive Care Unit) transport isolette. This state-of-the-art neonatal transport system provides a controlled, temperature-regulated environment for critically ill or premature infants, ensuring they remain stable and protected during transport.

Equipped with advanced monitoring capabilities, oxygen delivery systems and shock-absorbent features for both ground and air transport, the isolette allows Trinity Health First Response teams to deliver critical care safely and efficiently to our most vulnerable patients. By improving safety, comfort and clinical outcomes, this equipment ensures that even the tiniest patients receive the highest level of care during every step of their journey.

Televisions for Trinity Homes

Trinity Health Foundation purchased 10 new televisions for residents at Trinity Homes, bringing added comfort and enjoyment to daily life. This thoughtful investment enhances the resident experience by providing entertainment, connection and a sense of home.

GRANTS

American Cancer Society granted \$10,000 to **support cancer patients with travel-related expenses for treatment.** This generous funding helps reduce the financial burden for patients and their families, ensuring they can access the care they need with greater ease and peace of mind.

Give 360 granted \$4,500 to fund a new **Kidney Dialysis Unit (KDU) chair.** This contribution helps enhance comfort for dialysis patients during long treatment sessions, reflecting the power of community support in improving patient care and well-being.

Inspiritus Twice Blessed Campaign \$10,000 in matching funds was granted for the third year of a five-year campaign to **support the chapel at the new Healthcare Campus and Medical District.** This generous contribution helps create a serene, sacred space for reflection, prayer and comfort, enhancing the spiritual care available to patients, families and staff.

Building Hope Golf Tournament

With a lively “Girls Just Wanna Have Fun” theme, participants enjoyed sunshine, laughter and camaraderie while supporting a meaningful cause. Congratulations to the first-place team: Holly Johnson, Danielle Foster, Jade Teske and Lauryn Keller! This event highlights the incredible generosity and spirit of our community in supporting Trinity Health Foundation’s mission.



Chopper Drop

The third annual Chopper Drop was a soaring success! Trinity Health First Response Air flew over Souris Valley Golf Course, dropping nearly 1,000 golf balls from the sky. Congratulations to this year’s lucky winner, Thomas Carver, DO! Thanks to the generosity and participation of the community, proceeds from the event supported the purchase of the new 3D mammography system, enhancing breast care and early detection for women in our region.



Fuel the Fight

On September 7, Trinity Health Foundation hosted its 7th Annual Fuel the Fight event at Dakota Square ARCO, and it was a tremendous success! Attendees enjoyed family-friendly activities, including a dunk tank sponsored by Heritage Insurance Services, bounce houses for the kids, hourly door prizes and exciting raffle drawings.



Participants who purchased eight or more gallons of fuel at Dakota Square ARCO were entered into grand prize drawings. Thanks to the generous support of First International Bank & Trust, Kaelyn Cone won the grand prize: free gas for a year (\$75 per week for 52 weeks). 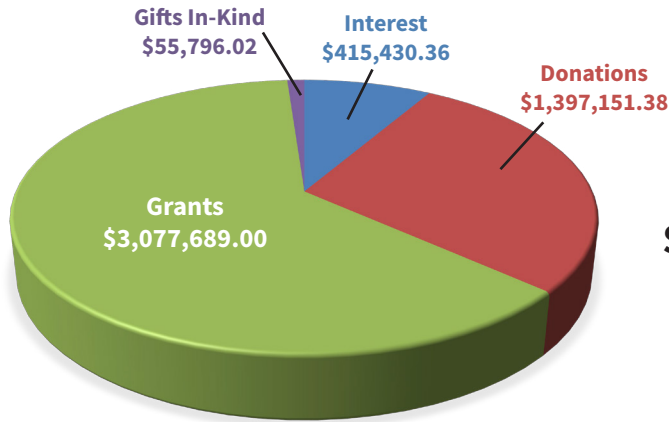

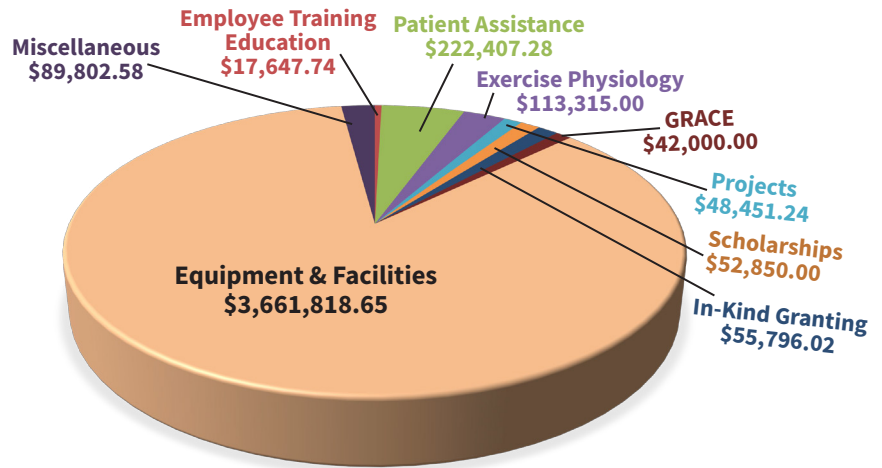
